- 5 & 8-hour passes are valid for the respective period on the date of purchase starting from when the pass first goes through a lift gate. - Day passes are valid from the date of purchase until the close of the final day. - Night-skiing passes are valid from 16:30 to 19:00 on the date of purchase. - Senior lift tickets are reserved for those 60 years of age and older. - When purchasing tickets, students and seniors (persons aged over 60) must present proof of their age (e.g. student identification or driver's license). - Children under elementary school age ride for free. However, they must be accompanied by an adult when purchasing the ticket and boarding the lift. *Season passes and other long-term passes require a ¥1000 security deposit in addition to the prices in the above table. Security deposits will be refunded upon lift pass return. - Lift ticket prices and types are subject to change during the season. *Please check our website.

Cautions for Skiers & Snowboarders

Notice to people wishing to ski at this resort

This ski resort makes its best efforts to ensure your safety. Please understand the following matters and observe the separately prescribed Action Rules at Ski Resorts to prevent accidents.

- Please be aware that there are specific risks in skiing. Exercise caution to avoid the following risks.
 - (1) Risk due to weather conditions such as snow, wind and fog.
 - (2) Risk due to terrain such as cliffs and irregularities.
 - (3) Risk due to snow conditions such as frozen snow surfaces and avalanches.
 - (4) Risk due to natural obstacles such as rocks and standing trees.
 - (5) Risk due to artificial obstacles such as lift facilities, buildings and snow vehicles.
 - (6) Risk due to contact with other skiers.
 - (7) Risk due to your own negligence.
- If you intend to ski outside of the areas controlled by the ski resort, you must read and abide by the "Niseko Rules". Furthermore, you must understand that there is an additional risk due to natural obstacles that are within the controlled areas, but outside any marked trails. Proceed with caution and at your own risk.
- Please do not let children act alone in a place where parents cannot keep an eye on them.
- This ski resort is not responsible for accidents due to negligence or disregard of this notification and the Action Rules at Ski Resorts. Those who cannot accept these matters are not permitted to ski at this ski resort.

Ski Resort Code of Conduct

- Do not hurt or threaten other people.
- Control your speed according to circumstances, such as the terrain, weather, snow quality, skiing skills, physical condition and congestion, so you can easily stop anytime to avoid danger.
- Take care not to interfere with people skiing in front of you.
- When overtaking other people, keep a sufficient distance from them.
- When starting to ski, joining other people or crossing across a slope, carefully look upslope to ensure your safety.
- Do not sit on a course. Refrain from stopping in a narrow area or an area with poor visibility. If you fall down, quickly clear space for other skiers.
- When climbing, walking and stopping, use the edge of the course.
- Attach flow stoppers to your skis or snowboard.
- Observe precautions given by notices, signs and announcements, and follow instructions from ski patrols and ski resort staff.
- If an accident occurs, cooperate with relief operations reporting, and disclose your identity regardless of whether you are a person involved in the accident or a witness.

Cautions for Lift Users

Your actions are related to the safety of all users of the chair lift. You have responsibilities and obligations when using a chair lift. Please observe the following.

When getting on a chair lift

1. Please ask for help if you are concerned about using a chair lift.
2. Point your skis or snowboard correctly ahead at the boarding place and stand ready.
3. If you fail to get on a chair lift, quickly get away from it.
4. Skiers should be careful not to bother the persons next to them with ski poles.
5. Place your backpack or belongings on your knees, and also be careful about strings attached to clothing and gear.
6. Snowboarders should attach flow stoppers to their snowboards and lean their high backs forward.

During a ride

1. Lower the safety bar and sit back on the chair.
2. Do not do the following while you are on the chair.
 - (1) Swinging the chair.
 - (2) Jumping off the chair.
 - (3) Fooling around or turning around on the chair.
 - (4) Touching lift poles, etc. with ski poles.
3. Do not jump off the chair if the lift stops.

When getting off a chair lift

1. Prepare yourself as you approach the place of arrival. After getting off the chair lift, proceed straight ahead.
2. If you fail to get off, remain seated on the chair lift.

Niseko Rules 2021-2022

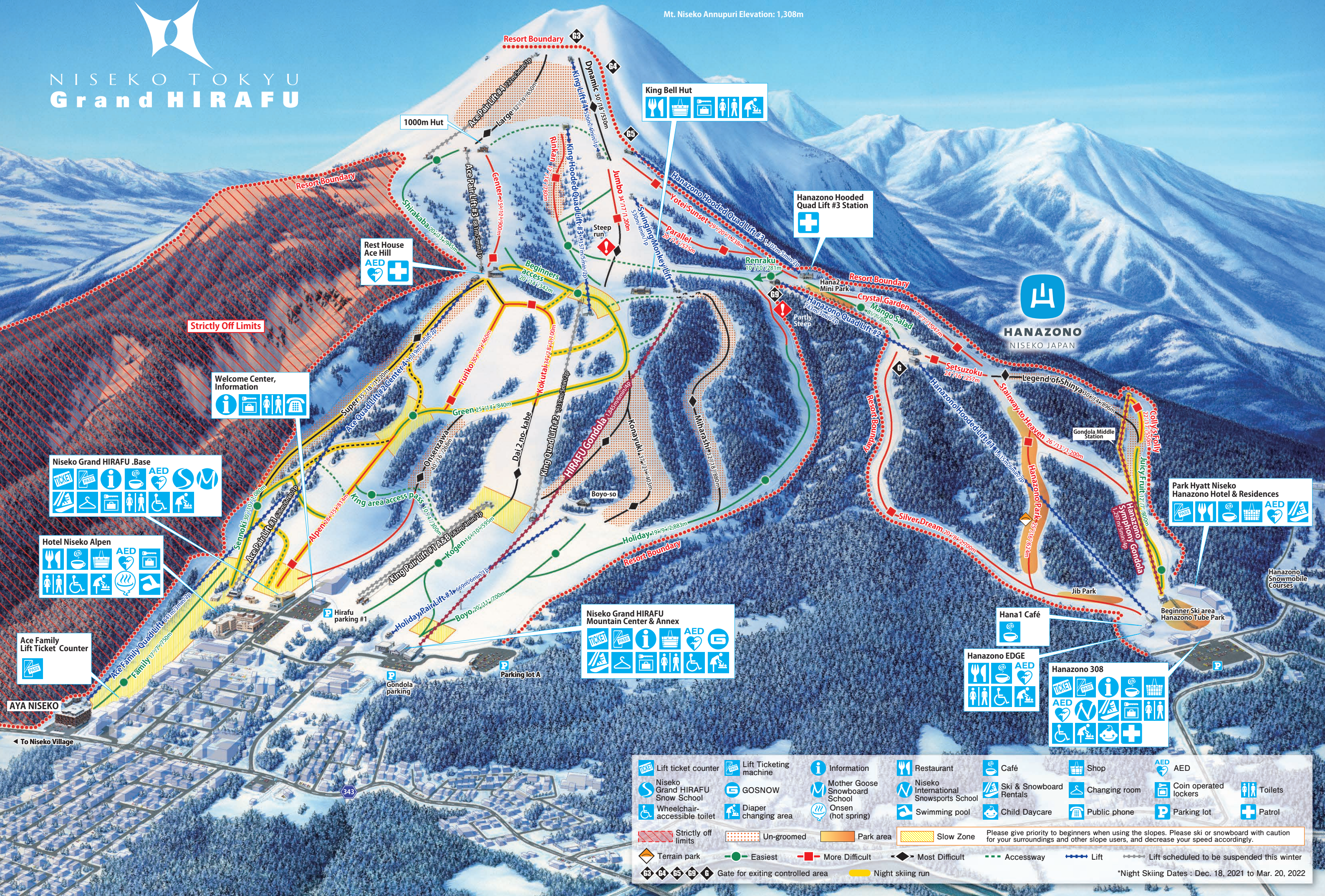
If you plan on skiing in uncontrolled areas, you must read and abide by the "Niseko Rules". Proceed with caution and at your own risk.

1. OFF LIMIT AREAS are strictly NO ENTRY - AT ALL TIMES.
2. Crossing boundary ropes is prohibited. Those who violate the rules may be refused from using all resorts facilities.
3. There is no safety control & no patrol beyond resort boundaries
4. If the gates are CLOSED, do not exit into the terrain beyond.
5. Daily NISEKO AVALANCHE INFORMATION is OFFICIAL Niseko Rules information.
6. Search and Rescue efforts WILL BE CHARGED for incidents outside resort boundaries.
7. Obey Ski patrol's instructions at all times.
8. Children under 12 must refrain from going out of bounds unless accompanied by a proficient adult leader.
9. Niseko Resorts, and the local community respect the freedom of mountain users and place a strong emphasis on SAFE USAGE of the mountain.
