

TERRITORIES

THE VILLAGE AT NORTHSTAR: ● 4 ■ 3 ◆ 0
With an abundance of restaurants and shops, as well as an express quad, express gondola, and pulse gondola, the heart of Northstar California Resort has it all.

TERRAIN PARKS: ● 8
Choose the extra small, small, medium, or large offerings from one of the TOP 10 Best Terrain Parks in North America.

MT. PLUTO: ● 4 ■ 20 ◆ 8 🏠 2
Known for its groomed runs, moderate pitch, variety of options, and gorgeous views of Lake Tahoe, Mt. Pluto is the perfect place for family cruising.

NORTHWEST TERRITORY: ● 6 ■ 17 ◆ 1
Ideal for low-intermediate cruisers, this terrain receives optimal sun exposure, making this soft-snow area perfect for any skill levels.

THE BACKSIDE: ● 0 ■ 4 ◆ 15 🏠 1
Known for its uninterrupted one-mile long advanced runs, this area also features glade skiing and intermediate terrain with loads of bumps and freshly groomed runs.

LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN*: ● 0 ■ 4 ◆ 6 🏠 3
Excellent views of Martis Valley, great snow quality, plenty of trees and steep inclines for the most experienced skiers and riders.

CROSS-COUNTRY, TELEMAR & SNOWSHOE: ● 7 ■ 9 ◆ 5
You can track, skate-ski, or snowshoe on 35 kilometers of groomed scenic trails with state-of-the-art rental equipment.

The orange color used on the mountain signage system signifies items of importance relating to terrain (E-Z Way Down, Freestyle Terrain, and Groomed Overnight symbols). The trail and lift designations on this map supersede any previous maps or brochures. This is a rendering only; actual conditions may vary.

WARNING: Skiing, snowboarding and other winter recreational activities involve inherent risks of injury and death. Trail conditions vary constantly because of weather changes and ski/snowboard use. Bare spots, stumps, ice, variations in terrain, moguls, forest growth, rocks and debris, lift towers, snowmaking and grooming equipment, and other natural and man-made obstacles and hazards may exist throughout the area. You must assume the risks of personal injury and death related to participation in recreational activities within this ski area. Violators of lift-and-run skiing may be prosecuted under Sec. 6531 of the California State Penal Code. It is unlawful for persons under the influence of an alcoholic beverage or any drug, or under the combined influence, to ski in a ski area (Sec. 12134, Placer County ordinance). Do not ski into "CLOSED" areas or beyond ski area boundaries; you may be prosecuted (CC 602Q) or held liable for the cost of search and rescue.

WARNING, RISK OF AVALANCHE: While snow safety and avalanche mitigation efforts help reduce the risk of avalanches, avalanches and snow slides may occur at ski areas, both inside and outside of the posted boundaries. Avalanches are an inherent risk of the sport due to the nature of snow and its application on steep, mountainous terrain. If found in closed terrain, you may be subject to legal prosecution AND the loss of skiing and riding privileges. Snowcats, snowmobiles, AND unmarked obstacles, may be encountered at any time. Non-lift access to ski area facilities such as uphill snowshoeing, hiking, or "skinning" is prohibited on Northstar California property.
